## Publication and Review Policy 2013/2016

### SCOPE

*Studies in Material Thinking* (SMT) is an international journal that reports on the peer-reviewed work of artists, designers and writers. It is a vehicle to support the communication and critique of artistic and design research from the vantage point of both the materiality and the poetics of creative research. The journal aims to develop a series of divergent positions, critical approaches and contestations around the term 'material thinking', centered as it is on an understanding of making, invention, design, creative practice and research methodology.

### ETHICS

SMT expects all authors to follow conventional academic standards of writing and to abide by the rules of copyright. At the time of submission, authors are expected to have obtained prior, full permission for the use of supporting material they have included in their work.

All listed authors are expected to have contributed significantly to the research design and implementation of the project, the analysis of the work presented and the writing.

Making a submission to the journal is automatically taken as confirmation that the work presented is an original, unpublished piece of work and is not under consideration at the same time for publication elsewhere.

### PEER-REVIEW PROCESS

All submissions to SMT are initially reviewed by the Editor-in-Chief and may also be reviewed by selected Co-Editors. At this stage, submissions may be rejected without peer-review if they are not considered to be of a sufficient standard or if they are not relevant to the journal. Authors are notified promptly so that they may re-submit elsewhere if they wish.

Submissions that are considered appropriate for the current (or future) call for papers will be sent as blinded files to two independent reviewers. The Editor's final judgment is based on reviewer feedback and authors are notified about the revisions required before final copy-editing can be undertaken.

### SELF-ARCHIVING POLICY

Authors may archive their published work in academic repositories, scholarly commons and personal websites, but in all cases, the SMT published version is to be acknowledged prominently as the first source and with a direct hotlink to the SMT website.
